The vocal match of Todd Sharman, Tony Mattina and George Manz to the Gibb brothers, Barry, Robin and Maurice, creates an eerie sense of seeing The Bee Gees live in concert. The performance captures a full history of The Bee Gees music, beginning with their 1967 breakout album "Bee Gees First" and songs such as "I Got To Get A Message to You" and "I Started A Joke," and continuing with "How Deep Is Your Love"

Principal Pops Conductor Michael Berkowitz brings years of international conducting experience to the concert stage. He is the music director/conductor for Liza Minnelli, working with her on the Tony Award-winning, "Liza's At The Palace." Berkowitz served as Marvin Hamlisch's music director for nine years and had a 13 year working relationship with arranger Nelson Riddle. On Broadway, he has collaborated with theatre legends such as Harold Prince and Stephen Sondheim.

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
